## Toffee Apple Cake

2 small eating apples, peeled  
 3 tbspn soft brown sugar  
 175g/6oz margarine  
 175g/6oz caster sugar  
 3 medium eggs  
 175g/6oz self raising flour sifted

### Filling

125g/4oz icing sugar  
 50g/2oz margarine  
 Few drops of vanilla essence

### Tipping

1 tbspn icing sugar  
 1/2 tspn ground cinnamon

2 x 20cm sandwich tins, oiled and base lined with greaseproof paper  
 Preheated oven 180c/ gas 4



Thinly slice apples and toss in the brown sugar until well coated  
 Arrange of the base of the tins  
 Cream together caster sugar and margarine till light and fluffy  
 Beat together eggs and gradually beat into the creamed mixture  
 Fold in the self raising flour and divide between the 2 tins  
 Bake for 25-30 minutes, until golden and well risen. Leave to cool in their tins  
 Beat together the filling ingredients and sandwich the cakes together with the apple slices to the top  
 Mix together topping ingredients and sprinkle over the top of the cake to finish

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Would all 2018 winners please return trophies to Hon. Sec by **Monday 19th August**
- Completed entries must be returned by **10.00pm Thursday 22nd August**
- Exhibits must be staged in the Methodist Hall between:  
6.30 and 9.00 pm on Friday  
Or 8am and 9.45am on Show Day.

**Please accept that these times will be applied firmly  
in the interest of good organisation and fairness.**

1. All exhibitions not contributed for sale in the end of show sale are to be clearly marked "**NOT FOR SALE**" on the class/Exhibitor card for that exhibit.
2. All exhibits for prizes must have been grown or produced by, or be entirely the work of the exhibitor, except where otherwise stated. Pot plants must have been in the exhibitors possession for at least 4 months.
3. No two or more persons may enter produce from one holding in any one Class.
4. No exhibitor may enter more than **2 exhibits** in each class.
5. Any objection to an exhibit must be lodged with the secretary in writing before 3pm with a deposit of £5, which will be refunded if the objection is sustained.
6. Vases supplied by the society must be used for all cut flowers and foliage entries. In the classes for effect, exhibitors must provide their own containers. Bowls or containers for all classes are not to exceed 9" at the mouth. A bowl has a mouth diameter equal to or greater than its height. A vase has a height greater than the diameter of its mouth.
7. Flowers are to be shown with their own foliage only, except where specified.
8. The committee reserve the right to move any exhibit, and have the power to refuse any exhibit whatsoever.
9. No exhibit or card shall be removed until after the presentation of prizes.
10. The committee cannot be responsible for any damage done to, or loss of, exhibits etc. during the show, but at the same time they will see that every possible care is taken of them.

- A. Points awarded as follows: **1st - 4 points 2nd – 2 points 3rd – 1 point.**
- B. The judges have the power to withhold any prize through lack of competition, merit or infringement. The decision of the judges shall be final.
- C. Prizes in Classes are: **1st-£1, 2nd-50p, 3rd-30p** unless otherwise stated.
- D. Prize money unclaimed by 4.30 will be regarded as a contribution to the Society
